The children and staff filled the gymnasium anticipating the performance. The presenters transitioned into the classrooms and assisted the students with making a tornado in a bottle using small water bottles, water, food coloring and liquid soap. They walked the students through every step on preparing their very own tornado. The students observed their bottles as well as their peers as they twirled their bottles and watched the outcome.
